#### Job purpose

- o To champion contemporary art within the Gallery and The Courtauld more widely
- To develop and curate important original exhibitions of contemporary art in the Gallery, raising the profile and extending the reputation of the Gallery in this area.
- To commission works of contemporary art for the Gallery's programmes
- To contribute to the programme of displays and special projects in the Gallery, and to work with external partners.
- To advise on the development of the collection in the fields of later 20<sup>th</sup> century and contemporary art.

## Main duties and responsibilities

### **Exhibitions and Engagement**

- 1. To contribute to the Gallery's programme of exhibitions, developing and delivering important new exhibitions of contemporary art and helping to diversify the Gallery's programme
- 2. To work closely with members of the Gallery team and other departments of The Courtauld on project development and delivery, and to maintain relevant documentation
- 3. To work with the faculty and other colleagues to develop exhibition proposals
- 4. To be responsible for exhibition-related publications and to collaborate on exhibition events and activities
- 5. To contribute to the programme of displays and special projects in the Gallery
- 6. To identify and develop opportunities for The Courtauld to work with partners off-site and online, extending its reach and engaging new audiences
- 7. To maintain networks, including with artists, galleries, collectors and others, contributing to the vitality of The Courtauld's relationship with the wider contemporary arts community
- 8. To help devise and deliver initiatives to ensure that the Gallery meets its aims to engage a wide and diverse community

#### Research, collaboration and teaching

9. To undertake and publish research in a specialist field, contributing to The Courtauld's submission to the Research Excellence Framework

- 10. To generate and pursue opportunities for the selective development of the collection, and to support the acquisitions process as relevant
- 11. To work across departments, including with the faculty, increasing collaboration and helping to strengthen and project The Courtauld's engagement with contemporary art
- 12. To be the lead for the Gallery's engagement with The Courtauld's taught curating programmes and initiatives
- 13. To actively support the teaching activities of The Courtauld, and to engage students with relevant projects and opportunities in the Gallery
- 14. To help the Gallery to meet the objectives of its Research England HEMG funding
- 15. To contribute to public engagement activity organised by The Courtauld, collaborating with the Research Forum and other departments
- 16. To contribute where appropriate to the work of the Public Programmes Department
- 17. To participate in international specialist networks, contributing to The Courtauld's reach and reputation for excellence

#### General

- 18. To contribute to the curatorial life of the Gallery, participating in relevant groups and discussions
- 19. To act as courier when required for works in any part of the Gallery's collection
- 20. To support the work of the Development Office, including the Friends programme, as appropriate
- 21. To help supervise volunteers, interns and technical staff, including for occasional projects such as exhibitions and redisplays
- 22. To act in accordance with all Courtauld policies and procedures including Equality and Diversity and Health and Safety, at all times
- 23. To undertake any other duties and responsibilities which are commensurate with the level of this role, as required
